An affectionate husband  
A kind and indulgent father

We know very little about the specifics of Dixon Hall's Revolutionary War service other than what is inscribed on his tombstone.

Dixon Hall was the elder brother in a family that included one older sister and four younger brothers. He married Anne [Anna] Hunt 5 Jan 1775 In Brunswick Co., VA. Their children were all born in VA and all but Hugh married in Hancock Co, GA: Hugh m. Amy Tyus in Greenville Co., VA; Elizabeth "Betsy" m. Littleton Reese; Mary Dixon "Polly" m. Francis Lewis; Dixon, Jr. m. Amy Goodwin Mitchell; Thomas Hunt m. Sarah Saunders [Sanders]; William m. Sarah Jane "Sally" Sasnett.

Dixon's second wife (7 Apr 1814 Putnam Co., GA) was Mrs. Millasant "Milly" Dejarnette Gregg; no children. He then married (abt. 1816 Hancock Co., GA) Milly Hutchinson and had a daughter, Millasant "Milly" Dejarnette, who m. James Edward Scott. The final marriage (5 Nov 1818 Greene Co., GA) was to Priscilla Baugh, who bore him a son, Wesley Dixon, who m. Caroline Olivia Smith.

Dixon came to Alabama in November 1818 to join his brother, Bolling Hall, and settled on 800 acres where he was buried in March, 1820. All of his children except for Hugh followed him to this area and became prominent citizens. One grandson, Dixon Hall Lewis, served as a U. S. Senator from Alabama 1844-48.
